Special Meeting
March 3, 2026

The Custer County Commissioners Special meeting was called to order at 2:10 PM in the commissioner's room at the courthouse. Attending were Commissioner Randy Corgatelli, Commissioner Will Naillon, Road and Bridge Supervisor Brandon Jones and Secretary Tina Hawkins.


Brandon provided the information and paperwork for the purchase of a replacement semi and lowboy trailer for the Road & Bridge Dept. He has located a 2013 KW T800, 18 speed truck for a cost of \$55,500.00 and a 2023 Kauffman 50-ton lowboy trailer at a cost of \$84,000.00. Of all the units that he researched this was the best fit. The total cost would include document fees of \$295.00 and amount to \$139,795.00. His plan is to put the old truck and lowboy trailer on the surplus sale site to see what he can get out of them. The monies for this purchase will be transferred from other budget lines within the Road & Bridge budget, as approved by Clerk Lura Baker. Commissioner Naillon moved to approve the purchase of the 2013 KW T800 truck and 2023 Kauffman 50-ton trailer at a cost of \$139,795.00. Commissioner Corgatelli seconded and the motion passed.


Brandon also discussed assisting with the Challis Classy Chassis car show for 8-hours. They plan to close off a short section of Main Avenue for pedestrian safety and additional car show space. The Board approved allowing the Road and Bridge to man the temporary barricades during the car show.

The letter of support for a grant application, that was provided for the N. Custer Hospital District was reviewed and signed by Chairman Randy Corgatelli. Steve Rembelski will be contacted for receipt of the signed support letter.

Commissioner Naillon reported on his recent visit to Washington D.C. He had very good meetings with Representative Simpson and USFS Forest Chief Tom Shultz. A grant opportunity was received from Rep. Simpson and it has been completed and turned in. Discussions were held on the sale of private lands to the government, as well as when the property is gifted to the government. Suggestion was made to contact the adjoining Idaho counties; Butte, Lemhi, Clark and Valley counties about how we can all present a unified front when facing such problems.

With no further business before them the meeting was adjourned at 2:55 PM.
